Donkey Welfare of Namibia is a non-profit organisation limited by guarantee, registered in the UK (Registration No. 5366345). It is dedicated to helping donkeys and the people who rely on them for a livelihood.

Donkeys should be seen and not hurt.



Every year, hundreds of donkeys are injured or killed in road accidents in Namibia. Often, they are run over at night simply because they can't be seen.

Donkey Welfare of Namibia has developed a special ear tag which reflects the headlights of oncoming vehicles. For the first time, drivers will be able to see and avoid the donkeys.

According to The Sunday Times, 90 people a year are killed in road accidents involving donkeys in Namibia. So imagine how many donkeys are injured or killed.

Donkeys are particularly vulnerable because at night they like to lie down on the road (the tarmac is warmer than the earth around it). The donkey doesn't recognise the danger of approaching cars and remains where it is.

Reflective ear tags make donkeys stand out even when they are lying down.

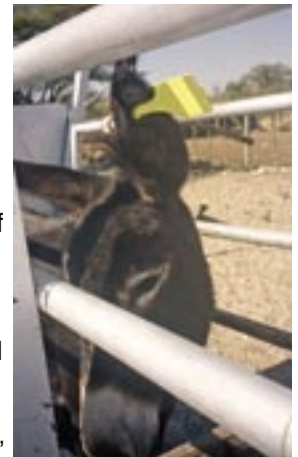
